3	Friday, March 27th, 2015 meeting of the New Mexico Board of
4	Licensure for Professional Engineers and Professional Surveyors
5	who. We are meeting today immediately following the rule
6	hearing, and we are meeting at 7500 Pan American Boulevard,
7	Northeast in the Auditorium Room of the Department of
8	Transportation District 3 offices in Albuquerque, New Mexico.
9	Let us convene.
10	I would like for a roll call.
11	MS. ROMERO: Paul Brasher?
12	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Here.
13	MS. ROMERO: Glen Thurow?
14	MR. THUROW: Here.
15	MS. ROMERO: Joshua Skarsgard? Ronald Bohannan?
16	MR. BOHANNAN: Present.
17	MS. ROMERO: August Meyers?
18	MS. MEYERS: Present.

21	MS. ROMERO: Cliff Spirock?
22	MR. SPIROCK: Here.

4	this meeting noticed?
5	MR. VALDEZ: This meeting was noticed in the
6	Albuquerque Journal, as well as the New Mexico Register and the
7	agency's website.
8	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Okay. We have before us the
9	agenda. Has everybody had a chance to look at the agenda?
10	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I move that we approve the
11	agenda as published.
12	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: We have a motion to approve the
13	agenda. Do we have a second?
14	MS. MEYERS: Second.
15	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: The motion is seconded. Is there
16	any discussion on this? Hearing none, all those in favor by
17	saying, "Aye."
18	ALL BOARD MEMBERS: All those opposed? Hearing none,
19	the agenda is approved.
20	The next item on our agenda regards the actions
21	we're going to take on the proposed rule changes. What I
22	thought what we would do is let's discuss A through H one at a
23	time and then we will make the appropriate motions. We'll make
24	individual motions on the different parts, motion for item A, a
25	motion for item B, et cetera. The first item on the agenda is

1	the general provisions, 16.39.1 Are there any comments or
2	discussion to be had?
3	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I'm ready to make a motion
4	on part 1.
5	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Is there any discussion on
6	16.39.1? Hearing none, if there's a motion.
7	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I move that we approve part
8	1, 16.39.1, General Provisions, as published and heard in the
9	rules hearing.
10	MS. MEYERS: Second.
11	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: We have a motion and a second. Is
12	there any discussion on the motion? Hearing none, all those in
13	favor signify by saying, "Aye."
14	ALL BOARD MEMBERS: "Aye."
15	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Those opposed? Hearing none, the
16	motion carries.
17	The next item is 16.39.2, Professional
18	Development. Is there any discussion on this?
19	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I think this would be if
20	I could ask Rick a question. I have all the changes and am
21	ready to read that into the record. Do you think it's
22	appropriate that we discuss that first or if I can make that in
23	my motion?
24	MR. WORD: I think it's good to discuss it briefly.
25	Just summarize what those are and we'll discuss them.

Page 6 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Mr. Bohannan has kept a record of 1 2 the discussion that was undertaken in the rules hearing. And 3 what he'll do here is he'll tell us how those came out. 4 MR. BOHANNAN: If I may, Mr. Chair, on part 2, under 5 the continuing professional development, we had a discussion on item 16.39.2.8(D) under "Requirements," and it was suggested 6 7 that we look at the ethics and keep the ethics portion retained in the motion but reduce that from four PDH credits to two PDH 8 credits. 9 10 In addition, there was another suggestion under D3 that the successful completion of short courses/tutorials, 11 12 distance-education courses offered through correspondence, 13 television, videotapes or the internet relevant to engineering 14 and surveying" be stricken, and in its place "Completion of 15 short courses, tutorial, webinar or distance-education course offered for self-study, independent study or group study and 16 17 through synchronous or asynchronous delivery method such as 18 live correspond, archival or internet based instructions." And 19 there was no other changes to that part 2 rule change. MR. SPIROCK: Mr. Chairman, question for 20 21 Mr. Bohannan. Wasn't there a change to Subsection E11? 22 MR. BOHANNAN: That would be correct. It would be 23 one PDH max and two per biennium, two every other year. 24 MR. SPIROCK: One PDH max, two PDH biennium? 25 MR. BOHANNAN: Correct.

1	Page 7 MR. TONANDER: I'm still not certain that's correct.
2	The way it's written right now it says, "one PDH maximum or
3	four PDH biennium." I believe that would stand because you're
4	simply at least that could stand, in that you're setting a
5	maximum of four, which is what your intent was, and you're
6	simply assigning what the credit is, one PDH one hour. That's
7	what it's equivalent to. There was no this isn't setting a
8	maximum or requirement to obtain that. That's the prior
9	portion.
10	However, having said that, I also brought up
11	during the discussion in the hearing why are we putting a limit
12	on that at all. Why are we making that change is my question.
13	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Specifically which change?
14	MR. TONANDER: Why are we putting a limit on it.
15	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: A limit on the number that you can
16	obtain?
17	MR. TONANDER: Yes.
18	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Towards your continuing education,
19	30?
20	MR. TONANDER: Yes.
21	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: I think the idea is going back to
22	when these rules were worked on a couple years ago is that so
23	somebody didn't just take all 30 hours of PDH in ethics. They
24	took a class besides something else. I think that was the idea
25	to put some ceiling on it. Not particularly scientifically

	Page 8 derived, but just to put a limit on it.
	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, my intent is that I want to
	see at least one hour of ethics each year or per renewal cycle.
	So I would like to see at least two, whereas it reads four now.
	And that's my intent and that's what I'm trying to that's
	what I will be trying to do in my motion. So if that's
	different than the understanding of the board, then I think we
	need to discuss it.
	MR. SPIROCK: Mr. Bohannan, we want to support that
	but in terms of wordsmanship, under D11 should it be two PDH
	hours per biennium, and then under E11, training, strike that
	entire training except two PDH per biennium. Or is it your
	intent to have one PDH per year accruing to two PDH per
	biennium as the minimum?
	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, it's my intent under D that
	we have at least two PDH credits of which shall be in ethics.
	That would be the first proposed change to what we have had.
	And then on Ell, I would change four PDH per biennium to two
	PDH biennium and I would leave the rest alone.
	MR. TONANDER: Mr. Bohannan, what you were then doing
	is saying you don't get credit for more than two biennium by
	making that change. You presently would be stating you need a
	minimum of two, but you get credit for no more than four with
	the language that's presented. But if you make that change, it
	will restrict it to two and you need two.

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1	Page 9 MR. BOHANNAN: That's a good point.
2	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Okay. Here's how we'll leave it.
3	You have you to take one PDH in ethics each year so it will
4	accrue to a total of two when you renew. You can take as many
5	as you want, but all you'll get credit for is four towards your
6	30 continuing education. You take four. All you need is two.
7	But if you take four, we'll give you credit for that. If you
8	take six, all you're going to get credit for is four.
9	MR. THUROW: Mr. Chairman, I think the discussion was
10	whether it has to be one per calendar year or can it be two per
11	biennium. And I think, if I remember the discussion, that we
12	settled on two per biennium. I believe in other words, you
13	could take a two-hour ethics course during your renewal cycle
14	and that will satisfy the requirement.
15	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Okay. So you're required to take
16	two per biennium. You can take four and get credit for four
17	against your 30 total requirement.
18	MR. THUROW: Yes. But you have to have at least two.
19	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, so if I've got this
20	correctly, on D we would keep in at least we would change
21	four to two in parentheses two of which shall be in ethics.
22	We would keep that in the rules under the first page under D.
23	And the second page under E11, the ethics training, we would
24	have we'd leave it alone. Basically, we would leave it
25	alone, if I understand, and I'm fine with that. Well, so right

1	Page 10 now the rules are showing we are striking out four PDHs per
2	biennium. We would leave that in.
3	MR. TONANDER: Correct.
4	MR. BOHANNAN: For what is in front of us and per the
5	rules, we would have to not strike out.
6	MR. TONANDER: I believe the way that it's been
7	edited there is actually the correct way. So the four PDH per
8	biennium is really restating the requirement and it really is
9	trying to create one hour equals one PDH with a maximum of four
10	accredited per biennium, which is what the chair has suggested.
11	And if I have a problem with that, we can discuss that in the
12	rules hearing.
13	MR. THUROW: Mr. Chairman, if we don't understand
14	this, can we expect our licensees to understand this?
15	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: I think we understand it. We're
16	just trying to formulate it or make sure it gets put down
17	correctly.
18	MR. WORD: Mr. Chair, members, I read it differently
19	because it says current language the language that is in the
20	regulations now says at least four of which shall be in ethics.
21	And if the intent is to reduce the minimum number of ethics
22	hours to two, then that has to be changed to remove the strike
23	out and leave clause and change four to two.
24	MR. TONANDER: Mr. Chair, sorry to keep going here.
25	I would call your attention to the earlier sections of that,

1	Page 11 particularly E4, because I think there's actually some words
2	missing from 11 that really makes this problem. This whole
3	section is conversion of other units of credit. And if you
4	look at 4 as a best example, it says one hour of professional
5	development in course work, da, da, da, da, da, is one PDH.
6	And I believe what might be missing from 11 is one hour of
7	ethics training, da, da, da, da, da, one PDH. That is setting
8	the equivalency. In parentheses, setting the maximum just
9	matches what's above it. For example, community service, you
10	cannot get more than four but you get one hour of it leaves
11	that one out as well. But one hour of literature review equals
12	one PDH with a maximum of six biennium. For whatever reason, I
13	believe "one hour of" is missing from ethics training. That is
14	saying one hour of ethics class equals one hour of a PDH. I
15	would challenge that number 10 is missing the same way, and I
16	don't agree with that. The way it infers now, you could go to
17	a 12-hour community activity event and get one PDH. I doubt
18	that was intended.
19	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Carl, I'm going to ask you to tell
20	us how E11 should read. It should say what?
21	MR. TONANDER: I believe it should say, One (1) one
22	hour of" that's all new language then "ethics training."
23	The four PDH biennium that's been killed remains out and that

25 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Which is one PDH (max 4) PDH per

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language that has been added in remains as presented.

Page 12 biennium" stays in. 1 2 MR. TONANDER: Correct. 3 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Now that you've done that, how 4 about D11 right above it, how do you see that one? "Successful 5 completion of ethics training up to two hours per biennial 6 renewal." I'm sorry. Up to four. MR. TONANDER: I believe that's correct. 7 8 MR. WORD: That's correct as it is. 9 MR. TONANDER: Correct, with intent. 10 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: No, because D is requirements. So 11 D11 will be a requirement. 12 MR. TONANDER: Correct, up to four hours. 13 MR. BOHANNAN: So you won't get anymore credit than 14 four hours. 15 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: You're required to take up to four and somewhere we know that it's two minimum, though. 16 17 MR. TONANDER: Mr. Chair, I would ask that if we are 18 making these edits that number E10, you may want to clarify 19 that point as well where I was trying to say one hour of 20 ethics. What is each civic or community activity? Is that really intended to be a 12-hour event, a 24-event is one PDH, 21 22 or are we setting the time equivalency? A 10-minute event 23 equals one PDH? 24 MR. SPIROCK: That could be, Mr. Chairman. If you 25 had a community meeting going on for 30 hours --

Page 13 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: The community activity is -- I 1 know we're in the conversion table here, the units conversion. 2 3 But the civic or community activity, one PDH, I think what it's 4 intended to say here is that an hour of that activity is one 5 PDH, but it only counts for -- only four of those biennium 6 would count. 7 MR. TONANDER: I would agree it's missing those critical words at the beginning of "one hour of." Right now 8 9 it's just "each activity" and it doesn't say whether it's a 10 10-minute activity or a two-hour or a 20-hour. 11 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Mr. Cooper, your thoughts? MR. COOPER: Mr. Chairman, board members, I believe a 12 13 solution to the problem is just to move the language in 10 and 14 11 and move it up here under number 4 where it states "one hour 15 of professional development," and so on, and so forth. I think that would cover it. You spend one hour at a charity event, 16 17 that would be defined in number 4. 18 MR. SPIROCK: Mr. Chairman, can we do this? Because 19 it wasn't discussed at the rules hearing.

20 MR. WORD: Yeah, I think you're getting pretty far
21 afield there.

22 MR. VALDEZ: Mr. Chair, members of the board, under 23 the professional PDH guide that's been in place for many years, 24 it describes that professional/technical societies may receive 25 two PDH per year for active participation serving as an officer

1	Page 14 or on a working committee and not just as a dues paying member.
2	The second requirement is may earn PDHs for attending
3	individual meetings or an organization and
4	engineering/surveying related topic is presented at a principal
5	part of the program. Attending regular committee and business
6	meetings would not qualify. And that's how it's defined in the
7	PDH guide.
8	MR. TONANDER: Mr. Chair, that's item 7 in here, not
9	10 or 11.
10	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Here's what we do. Mr. Tonander
11	had it right for E11. One(1) hour of ethics training on line
12	E11. And then one PDH, maximum of four PDHs per biennium. And
13	there's nothing wrong with D11 above, which says, "up to four
14	hours per biennium renewal." However, up to four. It doesn't
15	say two. We can include two, but it also says one, right?
16	Because D is the paragraph of requirements, D11.
17	MR. TONANDER: Mr. Chair, not to belabor this too
18	much, but factually I think the additional language on 11 is
19	unnecessary. Up to four hours per biennial renewal is
20	unnecessary because it's defined down below with all those
21	other maximums. And it simply would state "Successful
22	completion of ethics training." The numbers are provided in
23	other sections. It's a redundancy.
24	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Which one needs to be eliminated?
25	MR. TONANDER: The new language for D11. It is

Page 15 redundant to the other two portions. 1 2 MS. IDRISS: Yeah, because it's already repeated in 3 E11. 4 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Paragraph E is just the units 5 conversion. D is the requirements section, right? E10 needs to say you're required to get two but up to four will count. 6 7 That's what it needs to say. Now, own here in E11 under ethics 8 training, an hour of ethics training equals one PDH. 9 MR. TONANDER: And, Mr. Chair, I would agree except 10 that those two items above the ethics training, the community activity and the literature, both say maximums. 11 12 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: They do it the same way. But we 13 didn't discuss that. 14 MR. TONANDER: That's all right. Mr. Chair, I would 15 be happy keeping that. We can address that at a later time. 16 We need to tell Perry what to do when these get printed up. So 17 what we can do is fix E11. At the same time we could fix E10 18 and E9 in the process. The way we can do that is to read the 19 same way, to be consistent. And the way we can do that is as 20 long as the changes are consistent with the proposed rule presented at the hearing, if the board decides to change the 21 22 proposed rule so that it differs substantially -- when I talk 23 about differs substantially, we're fixing the wording, which I 24 think we can do. We can fix E9, 10 and 11. 25 MR. BOHANNAN: Actually, 9 is how 10 and 11 should

1 read. 2 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Perry, see how E9 is written where 3 it says one hour of literature review? 10 needs to say one 4 hour of each civic or community activity. Well, 11 needs to 5 say one hour of ethics training. That's what we will be making a motion. Say it passes, it will pass to read that way. 6 7 MR. BOHANNAN: Carl, do you feel comfortable making 8 this motion? 9 MR. TONANDER: Yes. 10 MR. BOHANNAN: I'll give you the language under you 11 D3 so you can read it. 12 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Carl, did you see the D11 that we 13 changed? 14 MR. TONANDER: I would say we can, but we don't have 15 to. It's redundant. We can fix it later rather than beating 16 this. 17 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: So this is getting simpler. Is 18 there any more discussion? Is there a motion? MR. TONANDER: I motion to approve part 2 as 19 20 presented with the following exceptions: 16.39.2.8(D), 21 modification of the language that was presented. It shall read 22 "D. Requirements: Each licensee is required to obtain thirty 23 (30) professional development hours (PDH) units during a 24 biennium, at least two (2) two of which shall be in ethics. A 25 maximum of ten (10) PDH units may be earned in self-directed

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1	Page 17 study. If a licensee exceeds the biennial requirement, a
2	biennium cycle, a maximum of 15 (PDH) units may be carried
3	forward into the subsequent biennium in accordance with what
4	has been previously reported to the board. PDH units may be
5	earned from participation in qualifying activities as follows."
6	That is one edit. Two further edits, 16.39.2.8 E10 will read,
7	"One (1) one hour of each civic or community activity, one PDH
8	(maximum of four PDH per biennium." And 16.39.2.8 E11 will
9	read one (1) hour of ethics training, one PDH (max four PDH)
10	per biennium."
11	MR. THUROW: Second.
12	MR. BOHANNAN: Would the maker of the motion please
13	add in the revisions to 16.39.2.8 D3 for the successful
14	completion?
15	MR. TONANDER: Yes. Also 16.39.2.8. D3 to read
16	"Successful completion of short course, tutorial, webinar or
17	distance-education course offered for self-study, independent
18	study or group study and through synchronous or through
19	asynchronous delivery method such as live correspondence,
20	archival or internet based instruction."
21	MR. THUROW: I agree to the amended motion.
22	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: The motion is amended and seconded
23	as amended. Is there any more discussion on this? Hearing
24	none, all those in favor signify by saying, "Aye."
25	ALL BOARD MEMBERS: "Aye."

1	Page 18 CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Those opposed by the same sign?
2	Hearing none, the motion carries. The next item
3	MR. THUROW: Mr. Chairman, please forgive me for
4	backtracking here. I was not clear on how we would proceed,
5	but I thought under part 1 we did have a change that Mr. Valdez
6	brought to our attention about having to have an active license
7	to is it beyond the scope?
8	MR. WORD: Beyond the scope.
9	MR. THUROW: Thank you. That's been clarified for
10	me.
11	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: The next item on the agenda is
12	paragraph C, Engineering Fees, 16.32.3. Is there some
13	discussion on that before we get into a motion?
14	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I'm ready to make a motion.
15	In the matter of 16.32.3, Engineering Fees, I recommend we
16	approve the rule changes as presented at the rules hearing.
17	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Wait a minute.
18	MR. BOHANNAN: 16.39.3. Wait a minute.
19	(A discussion was held off the record.)
20	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: For the record, what our agenda
21	for this board meeting this afternoon shows under agenda item
22	4C as being 16.32.3, Engineering Fees, should say 16.39.3. And
23	what our agenda shows for agenda item 4D as 16.32.4 should read
24	16.39.4. When we were discussing the rules at this board
25	meeting, the rule amendments that were discussed at an earlier

1	Page 19 meeting today and they too were advertised the same way.
2	But what was discussed at the rules hearing was
3	instead of 16.32.3, we discussed 16.39.3. In our rules hearing
4	when we discussed what was called 16.32.4, we were actually
5	discussing 16.39.4. There was no comment from anybody on the
6	board or in the audience as to the distinction between part 3
7	and part 4 being mislabeled, Section 1632. So we are going to
8	continue at this board meeting to discuss the rule changes for
9	16.39.3 and 16.39.4 because those are actually what got
10	discussed earlier today at the rules hearing, regardless of
11	what the agenda happens to have been mislabeled as, and take
12	those as typographical errors.
13	So the discussion on part 3. Is there any
14	discussion?
15	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I'm ready to make a motion
16	on part 3. In the matter of part 3, 16.39.3 I move that we
17	adopt the rules as presented at the rules hearing.
18	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: We have a motion. Do we have a
19	second?
20	MR. COOPER: Second.
21	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: We have a motion and a second. Is
22	there any more discussion on this? Hearing none, all those in
23	favor signify by saying, "Aye."
24	ALL BOARD MEMBERS: "Aye."
25	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Those opposed? Hearing none, the
1

2	themselves, the document themselves, the paragraphs, the text
3	themselves for part 3 and part 4 were on the Internet site.
4	The next item on our agenda is 4D, Incidental
5	Practice, which pertains to 16.39.4. Is there any discussion?
6	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I'm ready to make a motion.
7	In the matter of 16.39.4, I recommend approval of the changes
8	of rules as proposed in the rules hearing.
9	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: We have a motion. Is there a
10	second?
11	MS. MEYERS: Second.
12	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: We have a motion and a second. Is
13	there any discussion on this? Hearing none, all those in favor
14	signify by saying, "Aye."
15	ALL BOARD MEMBERS: "Aye."
16	CHAIRMAN BRASHER: Those opposed? Hearing none, the
17	motion carries. The next item is agenda item 4E, 16.39.5,
18	Surveying. Discussion?
19	MR. BOHANNAN: Mr. Chair, I plan on making a motion
20	and modifying the proposed changes. I propose to make a change
21	to item G to read "After four years or more as determined by
22	the board shall have four years of" striking
23	post-baccalaureate experience acceptable to the professional,"
24	striking those words, "keeping experience acceptable to the
25	professional surveying committee, this experience may be
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1	Page 21 acquired before or after certification as a surveying intern.
2	A candidate with a related science degree shall have four years
3	of surveying experience acceptable to the professional
4	surveying committee," adding subsequent "certification as a
5	surveying intern." And under paragraph K shall read "All
6	applicants for a professional surveying license shall show
7	proficiency in the English language and shall have a minimum of
8	four years of experience" and add "if a graduate of a
9	board-approved, four-year surveying curriculum or eight years
10	of a graduate of a board-approved related science curriculum"
11	to paragraph K.
12	MR. THUROW: Mr. Bohannan, you will see a slight
13	modification in the language of paragraph D as well. "If a
14	graduate of" has been added. And also a comma behind "New
